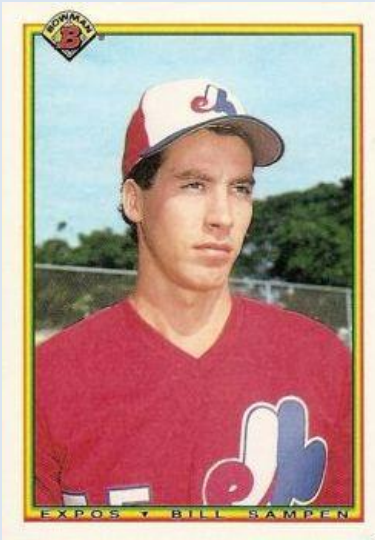

Bill Sampen



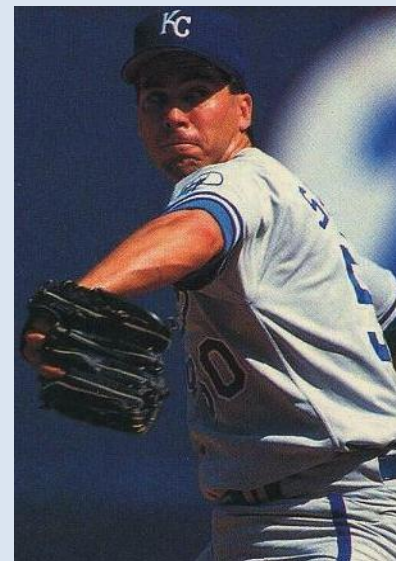
Bill was originally a 12th round draft pick of the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1985 but was drafted by the Montreal Expos in the 1989 Rule 5 draft. He began his big league career with the Expos in 1990 and went 12-7 with a 2.99 Earned Run Average. His rookie year ended up being the best season of his career. He was the first Montreal rookie since Carl Morton in 1970 to lead the clubs in victories.

In 1991, Bill went 9-5 but his ERA grew. Bill was suffering from arm troubles and had two surgeries within his first three years in the majors.

By mid 1992, Bill was traded to the Kansas City Royals for Sean Berry where he played until he signed with the California Angels and played there for his last season in 1994.

In his five seasons of MLB, Bill was better than .500 with a 25-21 won-loss record with a 3.73 Earned Run Average.

In his post playing career, Bill serves on the Board of directors for the Baseball Chapel Program which ministers to baseball players. Interestingly, if he hadn't played pro baseball, he may have made it in basketball as he showed great promise in that sport in his high school in the mid-west.
