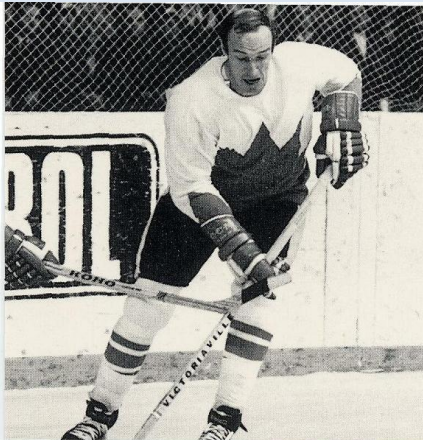

## Bill White



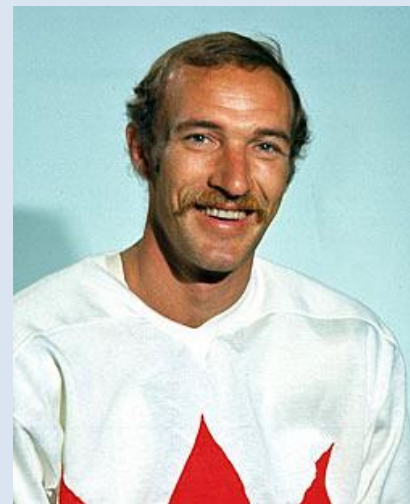
Little did Bill know when he turned pro in 1960 that he would play his first NHL game 7 years later in 1967 at age 28. That season he played 74 games for the Los Angeles Kings in their inaugural season. Bill played the next one and a half season in LA before being traded to the Chicago Blackhawks.

It was in Chicago that Bill really hit his stride. He played the next 6+ seasons with the Hawks and he and Pat Stapleton established themselves as one of the best defense pairs in the league.

Bill was tall, slim and balding while Pat was short, stocky and with a mop of hair, opposites in physical stature as well as style. Pat was the rusher while Bill stayed more at home and kept the puck out of the net – not that he couldn't also take the puck and go as well.

In 1972, Bill was chosen to play in the Summit Series for Canada versus the USSR. Bill played in 7 of those 8 games. His only goal in the series was huge as it came in game 8 and tied the score at 3-3 in the second period.

Bill's best NHL season came in 1972-73 when he scored 47 points. He was an NHL Second All Star 3 times in 1972, 1973 and 1974. He also played in 6 consecutive all-star games (1969-1974). Bill's career came to an end in the 1976 playoffs when he went awkwardly into the boards and damaged his cervical nerves. It was months before he could use his right arm properly again. Midway through the next season, 1976-77, he became the Blackhawks coach when Billy Reay was fired.
