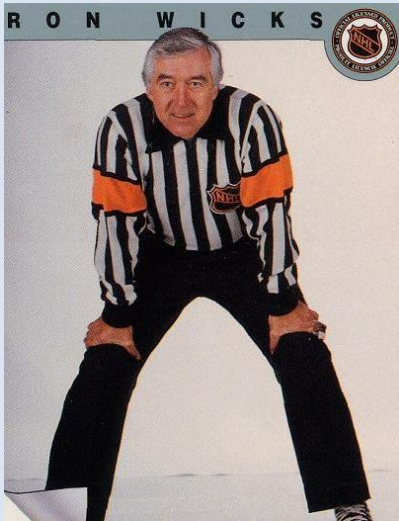

Ron Wicks



Ron was an NHL linesman and referee from 1960 to 1986. During this time, he officiated over 1,000 regular season games and 5 Stanley Cup finals. He was the youngest ever to officiate an NHL game, debuting at the tender age of 20.

In all, Ron has officiated 1,067 games as a referee and 375 games as a linesman, with over 100 playoff games to his credit. Of course, the life of an official isn't easy. His injuries include an eye injury, some lower back problems and a whole lot of hurt feelings!

His most memorable games were in New York City when as a 20-year old linesman, he was forced to act as both referee and linesman in the All Star game and Stanley Cup finals. He names his favorite venue to work as the Montreal Forum. The toughest player he

officiated was John Ferguson, and he calls Toe Black the toughest coach. The hardest call he had to make in his career was disallowing what would have been the winning goal by the Los Angeles Kings in the final regular season game of the 1967 season. The Kings were playing the Flyers and with both teams having a shot at first place. That call allowed Philly to clinch first place over LA in their first season in the newly expanded NHL.

Ron is now a successful real estate broker and enjoys working on his golf fame. He is a great story-teller and recently authored a book titled A Referee's Life.
